Dear friends,

I wonder how you imagine God? I wonder if the image of a white-bearded man in the clouds has come to mind, or maybe has in the past.



It's certainly how God has been depicted in everything from Renaissance art through to the Simpsons. It's not actually an un-Biblical idea.



There are a good number of times in the Bible where clouds make an appearance both physically and in imagery. Beautifully, they first appear as a part of God's promise after the flood: "I have set my bow in the clouds, and it shall be a sign of the covenant between me and the earth." (Genesis 9:13) Soon after, a pillar of cloud becomes the sign by which God guides the people out of Egypt and across the desert, and then becomes a protection from Pharoah's army as the pillar moves to being behind them.

From then on there are many moments throughout the Old Testament when God's presence is indicated by clouds, but it doesn't stop there. We only need get to Jesus's baptism to encounter the voice of God coming from a cloud to affirm the Father's pleasure. Clouds then appear in a load of imagery through to Jesus coming in the clouds in Revelation.

Now with all the rain that we've had recently, our relationship with clouds might not be the best ever, but my recent experience is that clouds can remind and reassure us of the presence of God, even when we can't feel it. When the clouds seem at their most heavy and dark, when life feels at its most heavy and dark, maybe that is when God is most present, most abundant, surrounding and holding us.

Church at the Margins



I always believed as a minister, that I needed to free myself from the ecclesiastic shackles of being within the walls of the church building and just doing 'churchy' or religious duties. It was because of this that I sought to create 'chaplaincies' at several 'pot-banks', the George Hotel, Port Vale Football Club and the Werrington Young Offenders Institution. If I engaged in these duties, it enabled me to spend time amongst people who rarely, if ever, came to church. How could I see people won for Christ if I was rarely amongst non-churchgoers.

The wonderful thing about the Swan Bank Mission was its people who never tried to stop me from being out in the community; I always felt that the members backed me in this calling. The temptation that comes to every minister is to spend all his time with church activities, visit only church members and attend business meetings - there was no end to these with their problems etc.

I could tell many stories of meeting folk outside the confines of the church through my various chaplaincies, but I will confine myself at this time to the work at Werrington. It was the then Home Mission Division that asked me to be the Chaplain at the Werrington Young Offenders Institute, and at first, I refused because of the time the task would entail. Only when it was agreed that I would be allowed to divide my pay for the job and share the work with John Mayer

and Norman Guntripp did I become the chaplain.

I would spend at least 4-5 hours each week at this institution. I visited teenagers in their cells, meeting them when they were first convicted and then before they were freed again. I led monthly Sunday services in the chapel and at Christmas was able to give each young person a card and little gift. A number of Swan Bank members would help me conduct services on the wings. I supported the young people in various official meetings they were required to attend as their lives were assessed; here I rubbed shoulders with the officers and staff. I only found one governor was a problem when we clashed over football. He was unfortunate that he supported the wrong team!

I constantly found myself on the wings as well as in the cells. Holding some keys enabled me to go through most doors and enabled me to visit the teenage offenders in their workshops and their classes. I was able to get alongside young offenders as well as the officers. Most of the youngsters were guilty of minor offences but some were individuals for whom violence was the norm, there were even murderers - knife crime was common even then.

I was fortunate to be joined by volunteers from Swan Bank who felt a call from God to assist in this work like Shirley Brooks, Jimmy Barrard and Bernard Gibbs. We all felt that each teenager needed to feel and hear about God's love for them. Most of these youngsters had a very poor home-life, if any home-life at all. All needed a lot of 'TLC'. I'm glad to say we were able to provide that in good measure. Shirley was seen as a mother to not a few and the way she made tea had to be experienced. We ensured that at least if we solved a little of their problems, by the time they were released they were aware that God loved them.


