Enabling Church – a vision being realised

Eight years ago, I had a conversation with a friend about how her friends- who had physical disabilities- found attending our church quite difficult. This thought challenged me, and after a few days surfing the internet, I found a practical course that was written to raise awareness and help to make church accessible to all.

What followed was a conversation with the minister and agreement with the church council to attend and then deliver an 8-week course on enabling church to members of our congregation. I now represent 'Enabling Church' on the Church Council and the Property Committee. Over the past few years, the accessibility and inclusion has improved greatly....

- We have provided a Sensory area within church for children,
- We welcome people of all abilities and try to meet their needs.
- We have removed the moving backgrounds on the visuals during the service making them easier to see.

However, we still have some areas that would benefit from changes to enable people with all abilities to attend and enjoy the facilities and services. For example,

- Access to all parts of church, including the platform, for those with mobility issues.
- Appropriate aids to ensure those with visual and hearing impairments can have an improved experience of church.
- Signing during the service and sermon- or a system of auto generated subtitles for people with hearing loss.

When I reflect on the progress over the last few years, I am grateful to God for His guidance and to the many members of Swan Bank who have become more aware and started to help our church to become a true 'Enabling Church'. Spotlight on Volunteering



Winter has arrived!

Winter has arrived, bringing extra work and challenges. Just last night, I left my wellies outside, only to find them full of snow this morning! It's a chilly reminder that the season of



frost and early sunsets is upon us.

My daily routine has adapted to the changing season. Shorter days mean much of my work rearing poultry—is now done by torchlight. Each evening, I'll have to coax the free-range turkeys into their shed. Unlike my well-behaved chickens that go inside on their own, the turkeys' instinct is to stay outside and seek trees for roosting. If I'm late and it's already dark, finding them in the woods can be quite a palaver. Roll on Christmas, eh?

Lower temperatures present their own set of challenges. Young chicks must be kept warm to prevent them from piling up and smothering each other. My mobile poultry sheds are on exposed fields, and sub-zero temperatures for more than a day can cause the water pipes to freeze. With over a tonne of water consumed daily by the birds, frozen pipes mean I'll be lugging jerry cans to each

shed. Costs rise and productivity drops, as the birds require extra feed and grow slower, and hens lay fewer eggs.

Today's snowfall does offer a silver lining: I can walk around the farm this morning and look for paw prints, which might reveal any comings and goings of foxes or other unwanted furry visitors.

Despite the difficulties, there is much to appreciate about winter. It's a beautiful season, not just for the occasional snowy landscapes but also for the still, misty days where the hills stand majestically above the lower ground. You cannot



fully appreciate this beauty from photographs; you need to be there, enveloped in it, to truly experience the peace and wonder.

Winter is often used as a metaphor for hardship, but it's a character-building hardship that fosters resilience as we meet challenges and solve problems. Winter will pass, and with it, spring will arrive, bringing brighter days and new growth, reminding us that hardship, like winter, is temporary and purposeful.

Homeless Hospitality

Homelessness and rough sleeping is nothing new and for many years we have read about how the Government and Councils plan to tackle this problem. During the pandemic, we saw a huge effort made to get all rough sleepers off the streets and into temporary accommodation with the 'Everybody In' campaign. And yet, a report recently published indicates that homelessness is sadly increasing across our city, with enquires up 28% on the previous year, with rough sleepers being the most visible form of homelessness.

To that end, it was decided that following on from our recent 'Church on the Margins' initiative, we would, as a church do something practical to help rough sleepers in time for this coming winter. So, on the 14th November, Swan Bank opened its first winter Soup Kitchen in the coffee lounge, aimed at showing hospitality and feeding those most in need from Burslem and the surrounding area.

Hot lobby, vegetable soup and fresh bloomer



bread was served to 13 individuals that joined us for the 2-hour session, and the plan is to open every Thursday lunchtime through to the end of March 2025.

A huge thanks to all our volunteers for getting on board, and I look forward to providing regular updates over the coming months on how this initiative develops.


