Dear Friends,

Happy New Year to you all. What a blessing it is to know that whatever 2025 will hold for us we can be confident in the enduring presence of God with us.

We thought it would be good to share something of our Christmas Day outreach with you. We had a wonderful day, though it is fair to say that the run up was, as ever, hectic! Over 80 guests plus our volunteers shared in a fabulous Christmas lunch in the building. Twenty of our homeless community were served with Christmas-in-a-Bun at church and 328 meals were delivered out to those in their homes.

All those who enjoyed our hospitality were so thankful and those who joined us had a great time as they shared in the service, had the wonderful food and also, of course, joined the fun and games afterwards. As you can imagine, none of this would have happened without the sacrificial giving of peoples' time, talents and resources. If you helped in any way, please know that we are SO thankful and that your input has hugely blessed others and shared something of the love of God with them.

We are mindful that so much of what we do at SwanBank is dependent on those who are willing to step up and help. How we use our time as Christians is an important part of our discipleship and expresses our commitment to serving the church and its mission through which we serve Christ himself. We are blessed to be part of SwanBank and know that God is challenging us to be present and active in serving our community evangelistically and practically.



To serve well, we need the people resources to make a difference and, crucially, we also need to be spiritually tuned into God.

With this in mind, we have an advanced notice so we can sort this out in our diaries. As a church we are designating Lent 2025 as a time of deep and focussed prayer and reflection.

To do this wholeheartedly, we will not be having church business meetings during the 40 days of Lent, which begins on 6th March. Instead, there will be opportunities to pray individually and together as a church family. We will also be encouraging us all, including those in small groups, to commit to coming together for whole church Bible study and prayer.

You'll hear more of this in due course but please be encouraged to make a note of this and also discuss it with your small group if you are in one.

In Lent 2025 we will be going deeper with God. But for now, may you know God is with you in 2025.

Our two Christingle services were well attended as ever. They really are very special services for all the family.








Christmas Eve
