Message from our Ministers...

Dear friends,

What is it about February? After the hustle & bustle of Christmas and New Year, frumpy February seems to suffer a character bypass and stubbornly drags its feet while we anxiously wait for better weather and more daylight. Apparently in the UK during February – apart from the obvious Valentine's Day – we can also celebrate British Yorkshire Pudding Day (Feb 4th); National Sickie Day (5th); Ice Cream for Breakfast Day (6th); and Drink Wine Day (18th).

Of course, that doesn't mean that nothing happens at SwanBank in February! All the usual activities continue with the addition of the construction of our new hospitality area in the foyer. We continue to preach the gospel in word and deed, supporting the most vulnerable in our community and caring for our church family and beyond.

As was mentioned in last month's newsletter, throughout Lent we will be setting aside time to pray and focus on our journey with Jesus. Each Tuesday evening, beginning on Tuesday 11th March, we will be gathering from 7pm for prayer, Bible study, discipleship and fellowship. We ask that all small groups attend this, maybe instead of your normal groups. All are welcome and we do encourage as many as possible to come along. It is incredible the difference that attendance at these groups can make, not only to the individual, but equally, the whole church family.



We will also be kicking the whole of Lent off with a day of prayer & fasting on Ash Wednesday (5th March) where the church will be open and resources provided to come and pray between 7am and 7pm. There will also be three 30 minute opportunities for gathered, led prayers at 7.30am, 12pm and 6.30pm.

So what are we doing in February? Well, the encouragement is to prepare for the journey of Lent, by both getting dates in your diary, and also making a decision to commit to attending as many as possible of the events that are happening.

Hebrews 10:23-25 teaches,

Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who has promised is faithful. And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching.

New Year City Celebration Update

A really encouraging New Year United Celebration took place at Swan Bank on Sunday

5th January. Despite the snowy weather, it was so encouraging to see so many Christians come together from many different churches to worship & pray for the City in its centenary year. Paul Critchley assembled a band from different churches to help lead a powerful time of worship.

Robert Mountford, the Staffordshire County Ecumenical Officer, reminded people that 2025 is the City's 100th centenary. The first application for city status was originally refused by the Home Office because Stokeon-Trent had fewer than 300,000 inhabitants - the usual minimum population for city status - even after becoming a federation of six towns in 1910. However, a direct approach to King George V changed that and, on 5th June 1925, Stoke-on-Trent gained city status in recognition of its considerable contributions to the pottery industry.

The Bishop of Stafford, Matthew Parker, concluded the celebration by bringing a timely message based on the prophecy from Isaiah 60: "Arise, shine, for your light has come and the glory of the Lord has risen on you."

He encouraged us to not to be afraid to look for opportunities to be salt and light in our communities.

Swan Bank Kids

Swan Bank Kids continues to thrive, and the children and young people particularly enjoyed all the events running up to Christmas, ranging from being part of the church Nativity, to the party afterwards and then onto the Christingle.

We are already well into a new term following the church evening theme of the Fruit of the Spirit and seeing how we can show Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Faithfulness, Humility and Self-Control to others as the fruit of God in our lives.

Live Wires (aged 3-7), Whizz Kids (7-11) and Forge (11-16) all follow the same theme, albeit presented in very different age-relevant ways. We always seeking to learn together in an informal setting about walking with Jesus in a new or deeper way, whilst making time to have fun together and develop both new and existing friendships in our church family.

We do also of course have provision for the under threes within our Stay & Play area. This is in a designated area within the main church auditorium. In addition, a creche is available in the Fellowship Room (where the morning service is also live-streamed) unless there is All-Age Worship. Parents or carers do need to stay with and supervise their children in the Stay & Play area and in the creche in the Fellowship Room.

None of this would be possible without our wonderful team of volunteers – both leaders and helpers. We are however, currently in particular need of those who are willing and able to lead sessions, either on a regular basis or to cover existing leaders when they take a well-earned break. Unlike many churches, Swan Bank Kids runs during the 10:30 service every Sunday of the year, including school holidays, with the only

exception being when we have All-Age worship. Please pray for us as a team of volunteers and consider prayerfully if you could join that team. If you would like to discuss this further, please do not hesitate to contact me (David), Nick or Shirley (Volunteer Co-Ordinator). Standard safeguarding procedures and documentation would of course then need to be completed.

We would of course love to see even more children and young people coming in to Swan Bank Kids work on a Sunday morning. Parents or carers are very welcome to come in with their child, particularly if it is for the first time – but only if they want to. Do please however, make sure that one of the Swan Bank Kids leaders are aware of any allergies or special requirements. Forms are available for this purpose. We look to forward to seeing further children and young people joining in the fun time we have together, learning more about God and our walk with Him.
